Every top line barbershop chorus in the North to face Preston in competition during the last two months has been forced to throw in the towel.

The group's recent wave of success has also prompted some to talk of prizes nationally.

The latest trophy to fall to the Red Rose line-up came at a prestigious music festival in Alderley Edge, Cheshire, at the weekend.

The win was by no means a close shave despite a challenge from the best of Yorkshire and Greater Manchester.

The contest adjudicator described the victory as "comfortable."

And later a spokesman for the Preston group said: "That surely confirms we have no one to fear at all now in the North of England."

Only recently the Red Rose line-up walked off with the barbershop trophy at Tivham St Annes music festival.
