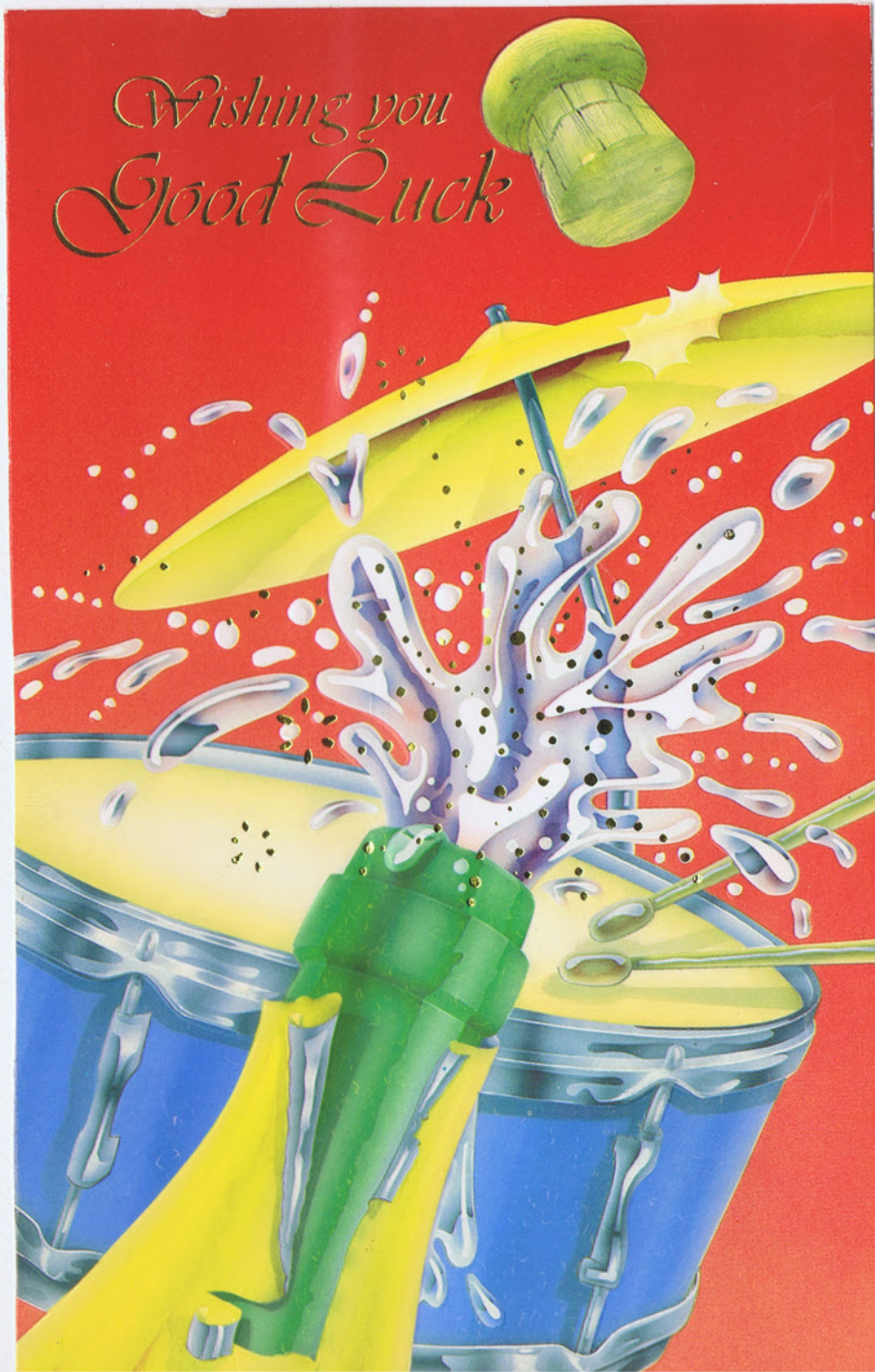
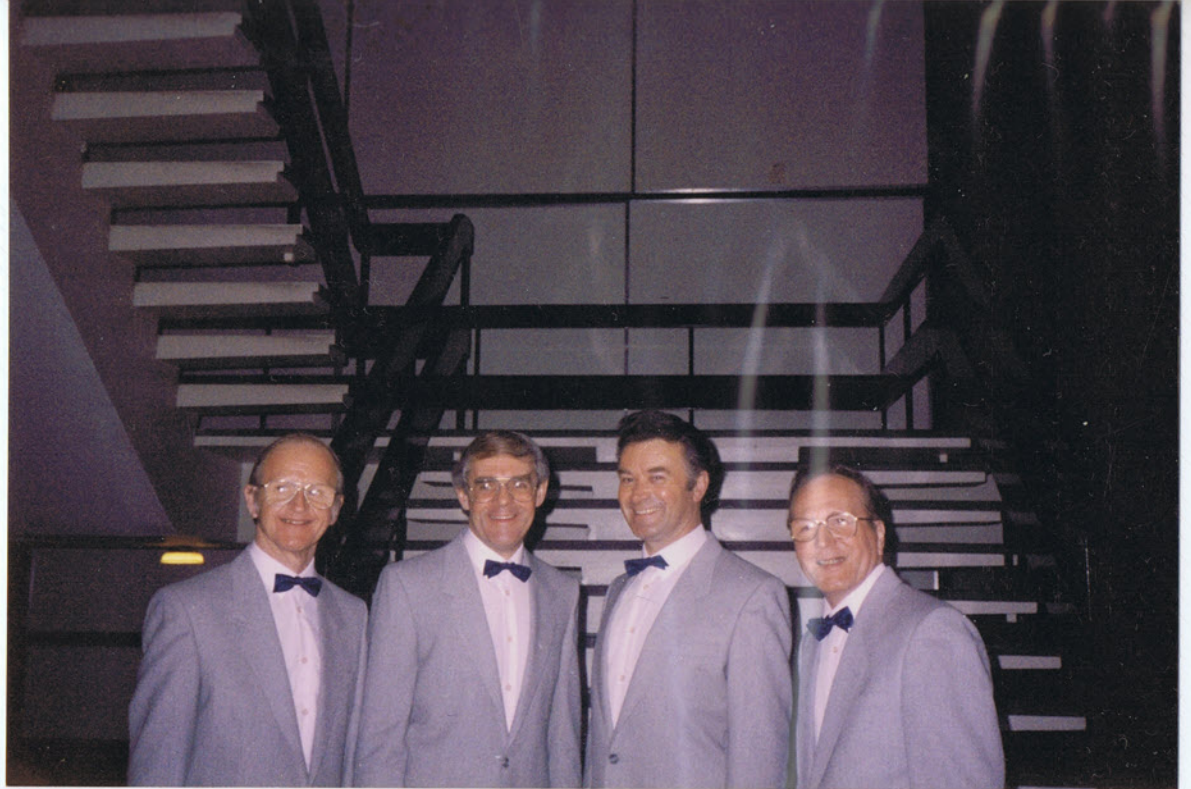
Richard is musical director for the club's Red Rose Chorus who will be taking part in the British Association of Barbershop Singers competition at the Octagon Theatre.
