SINGING snipper David Fell has brought "hairmony" to a group of Lancashire performers.

For 22-year-old David of Langholme Road, Penwortham, is the first barber to sing in the Red Rose Barber Shop Harmony Chorus. The gents hairdresser proved to be a cut above the rest when he entered auditions - now he sings bass with the Preston-based group every Thursday night.

David, who works at the Essanelle Now salon in the Fishergate Centre, first turned into barber shop singing when he heard the group performing in aid of the Armenian Earthquake Fund.

Since then he has been hooked.

He explained: "I went along to listen to the group and I decided to give it a go. When they found out I was a hairdresser it caused a lot of amusement because they often tell audiences that there are no barbers among them - now that has got to change."
